Classes will begin to introduce choices of enterprise craft activities to produce and sell to parents during parent engagement afternoons. Enterprise woven across curriculum and embedded into each key stage.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Year 11 -14 (Age 15-19) AQA accreditation award scheme.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Students from year 11 begin to work towards AQA award accreditations, developing their independence and preparation for adulthood. Post 16 provision, Year 12-14. AQA, 3 year rolling program incorporating Having Good Health. Employment & Vocational, Independent living & life skills, Exploring personal interests. Alongside this we offer a termly AQA option program.</p>

Work Experience.	<p style="text-align: center;">Students will begin to experience internal small activities associated with developing work experiences skills.</p> <p>These activities will include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Small office-based tasks such as photocopying. • Collection of classroom supplies, i.e. soap, paper towels, gloves, stationary. • Delivering items to other classrooms and main office. • Collection of lunches and returning items at the end of the lunchtime session. • Developing the College Garden area, to access and grow our produce, to then develop into the College enterprise scheme. • Volunteering with the communication café. • Volunteering with Martin and Andrew to complete small, odd jobs around the Riverwalk site. 											

3,8	<p style="text-align: center;">Year 11 (Age 16). Early transfer review meetings.</p> <p>Year 11 students will have an early transfer review, at which time it will be decided if remaining at Riverwalk and transitioning to post 16 or if transitioning to an alternative post 16 provision is an option. If the decision is to transition to an alternative Post 16 provision our independent career’s development practitioner (Christine Walton) will advise on alternative provisions and offer students and parents guidance on next stops.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Year 14 (Age 19)</p> <p>An early transfer review will take place, during this review it will determine if students are able to transition to an additional post 19 provision. Alternative post 19 provisions will then be discussed, and parents advised on next stages by our independent career’s development practitioner (Christine Walton).</p> <p>If it is decided that education will cease to maintain, parents and the adult social care team will look into arranging a bespoke care package to be put into place.</p>
Aspirations are embedded and captured in annual EHCP reviews.	
3,7	<p style="text-align: center;">Year 11 (Age 16) & Year 14 (Age 19) EHCP review names next provision.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Year 11 and Year 14 students will visit new placements and attend organised transition days.</p> <p>Year 11 students who will be remaining at Riverwalk to attend our post 16 provision, will have organised transition sessions and gradually build up additional time spent in the college building.</p> <p>Year 14 students who will be leaving Riverwalk post 16 will drop down to 4 days between Jan -April then drop to 3 days between April -July.</p>
